The Catechism – 1st Article I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth.

What does this mean?

I believe that God has made me and all creatures; that He has given me my body and soul, eyes, ears, and all my members, my reason and all my senses, and still takes care of them. He also gives me clothing and shoes, food and drink, house and home, wife and children, land, animals, and all I have. He richly and daily provides me with all that I need to support this body and life. He defends me against all danger and guards and protects me from all evil. All this He does only out of fatherly, divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness in me. For all this it is my duty to thank and praise, serve and obey Him. This is most certainly true.

Large Catechism - What is meant by these words when you say, "I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth"? Answer: I hold and believe that I am God's creature, that is, that he has given me and constantly sustains my body, soul, and life. Moreover, we also confess that God the Father has given us not only all that we have and what we see before our eyes, but also that he daily guards and defends us against every evil and misfortune, warding off all sorts of danger and disaster. All this he does out of pure love and goodness, without our merit, as a kind father who cares for us so that no evil may befall us. Hence, it inevitably follows that we are in duty bound to love, praise, and thank him without ceasing. Whenever we escape distress or danger, we should recognize how God gives and does all of this so that we may sense and see in them his

fatherly heart and his boundless love toward us. Thus our hearts will be warmed and kindled with gratitude to God and a desire to use all these blessings to his glory and praise. – *Large Catechism*

The first four stanzas are a meditation on Christ's redemptive work. The fifth stanza turns the meditation into a prayer for perseverance. Throughout the hymn, the author weaves together images and phrases that recall several Bible passages in order to confess his confidence in the work of Jesus on behalf of sinners, applying them especially to the individual, that is, to me personally.
