5th Commandment

## This Week's Catechetical Theme: 5th Commandment

We continue our consideration of the Ten Commandments this week by focusing on the Fifth Commandment, which teaches us, "You shall not murder." God is the author of life (Acts 3:15). He gives and He takes away (Job 1:21). As we confess in the Creed, He is the Lord and giver of life. He desires not the death of anyone (Ezek 18:32). To that end, to protect the lives which He gives, the LORD has given the Fifth Commandment. "You shall not murder," is God's revealed will that we are to protect and defend life in all its stages, from the very beginning, when it is conceived, to the very end, when death occurs. What the Lord gives is the Lord's to take away—not ours. And so, in the Fifth Commandment we learn to fear and love God so that we help and support our neighbor in every physical need. Tues: What does the LORD say to Jeremiah? Does this agree with yesterday's Psalm? What does this passage teach us about our lives, even our future? Wed: How does Cain break the 5<sup>th</sup> Commandment? How had the sin already taken place in his heart before he killed his brother? Where does our hatred begin? How does God's protection of Cain teach us about life? Thurs: Where are Jesus and John the Baptist? How does John respond when he is in the presence of Jesus? What does this passage teach us about life, even in the womb? About faith? Fri: How do Joseph's brothers feel about him? What do they plan to do? How did the brothers sin against the Fifth Commandment? Sat: In preparation for Sunday, reflect upon today's texts.
