6th Commandment

This Week's Catechetical Theme: 6th Commandment

With the Fourth Commandment, the LORD protects His institution of the family. With the Fifth, He protects His gift of life. This week, we focus on the Sixth Commandment, by which the LORD upholds and protects the sacred institution of Holy Matrimony. Even before the fall into sin, the LORD had established one man and one woman to live together, forsaking all others, and to be devoted to one another. This was to be a comprehensive union of body, mind and spirit, from which life would flow as children were given. While the devil, the world, and our sinful flesh desires to tear down this holy union, the Sixth Commandment is God's Word by which He teaches His people to consider marriage as a gift of God, and honor it with our life and actions. Questions to Discuss in the Home

Sun: Reflect upon today's text and sermon. **Mon:** Who establishes marriage? When did He establish marriage? Had sin yet entered into the world? How were Adam and Eve to treat one another? What would come forth from them? **Tues:** What question did the Pharisees ask Jesus? Why does Jesus say that the Old Testament people had been allowed to divorce? What does Jesus point them to? How is Jesus like a faithful husband? **Wed:** How are wives taught to relate to their husbands? In what role is the husband? How is Christ Himself the model for the husband? How then is the husband supposed to treat His wife? What is marriage given to be a picture of?

Thurs: Does Paul give the impression that it is bad to be single? In what condition does he encourage a single person, or a widow, to stay? If a person does enter into marriage, how is he or she to behave? (See verses 10-11.) If a Christian is married to a non-Christian, how should the Christian behave?" **Fri:** How does this passage sound like Wednesday's passage from Ephesians? How does verses 5-6 instruct wives? How does verse 7 instruct husbands? **Sat:** In preparation for Sunday, reflect upon today's texts.
