8th Commandment

This Week's Catechetical Theme: 8th Commandment

With the Eighth Commandment, the LORD protects a person's name and reputation. In love and service to our neighbor, we are to speak in ways that uphold our neighbor's name, and his reputation. When we fail to defend our neighbor, or worse, when we speak in ways that harm his name and reputation, we sin against this commandment. Certain authorities must cast judgment, but the Scriptures teach us to speak the truth in love. We do not ignore sin, but we remember that love covers a multitude of sins, and we make every effort to put the best construction on everything, and to speak of our neighbors in the kindest way. God bless your time in God's Word.

Questions to Discuss in the Home

Sun: Reflect upon today's text and sermon. Mon: How does this passage teach us to treat our fellow Christian, even if he or she would sin against us? Are we encouraged to go tell everyone about it? How does this protect the reputation of our neighbor? How is this a loving work? Tues: What does this passage teach us about speaking falsely? Does this affirm Luther's meaning of the 8th Commandment? When we sin against the 8th Commandment, what do we deserve? Wed: What was the goal of the council; what did they intend to do to Jesus? What sort of witnesses were provided to speak against him? Who is the only person to speak the truth in this account? Thurs: How do these passages encourage us to speak to our neighbor? What does it mean to speak the truth "in love"? Do we speak in such a way as to harm our neighbor, or to help him? Fri: How does James describe the tongue? How is it that the tongue is dangerous? How can the tongue be used for good? How might we learn to control our tongue? What sort of words do we desire to speak to our neighbor? Sat: In preparation for Sunday, reflect upon today's texts.
