This Week's Catechetical Theme: The Close of the Commandments

Throughout our study on the Ten Commandments, we have seen that God's good and gracious will for our lives is to love Him and to love our neighbor. Love is the fulfillment of the Law (Rom. 13:10). This week, we turn our attention to the Close of the Commandments. Here, we see that obedience to the Law carries the promise of God's grace and blessing (Ex. 10:5-6). Yet, to those who break these commandments, God threatens punishment. Therefore, we should fear God's wrath and not do anything against them. God bless your time in His Word.

The Catechism: The Close of the Commandments

What does God say about these commandments?

He says, "I, the Lord your God, am a jealous God, punishing the children for the sin of the fathers to the third and fourth generation of those who hate Me, but showing love to a thousand generations of those who love Me and keep My commandments." (Ex. 20:5-6)

What does this mean?

God threatens to punish all who break these commandments. Therefore, we should fear His wrath and not do anything against them. But He promises grace and every blessing to all who keep these commandments. Therefore, we should also love and trust in Him and gladly do what He commands.
