The Holy Trinity

This Week's Catechetical Theme: The Holy Trinity

This week marks the beginning of a new catechetical focus: The Apostles' Creed. Over the next several weeks, we will examine the three persons of the Holy Trinity, their work, and what they have done for us. We will look at the work of the Father, the work of the Son, and the work of the Holy Spirit, and we will grow in our wonder at the glorious mystery of the Holy Trinity. We begin our study of the Creed by considering the truth that God is Triune, three divine persons in one God. "The Father is one person, the Son is another, and the Holy Spirit is another. But the Godhead of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit is one: the glory equal, the majesty coeternal" (Athanasian Creed, sts 5-6). The Lord bless your time in His Word!

The Catechism: Augsburg Confession - Article I (God)

Our churches teach with common consent that the decree of the Council of Nicaea about the unity of the divine essence and the three persons is true. It is to be believed without any doubt. God is one divine essence who is eternal, without a body, without parts, of infinite wisdom, and goodness. He is the maker and preserver of all things, visible and invisible [Nehemiah 9:6]. Yet there are three persons, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit [Matthew 28:19]. These three persons are of the same essence and power (1-3).
