CATECHETICAL THEME:

God the Father – Preserver

This Week's Catechetical Theme: God the Father – Preserver

We believe in God, the Father Almighty, which means that we believe that God created us. This is what we studied last week. But our loving heavenly Father is not the sort of God who abandons His own creation—even if His creation is now tainted with sin. On the contrary, God the Father Almighty not only creates us, but He also preserves us. As we confess in the meaning of the First Article, "I believe that God has made me and all creatures...and still takes care of them." We also teach that "He defends me against all danger and guards and protects me from all evil." This preservation is the work which our heavenly Father does for us out of His "fatherly, divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness in (us)." This is the topic for this week's devotional material. God bless you time in His Word!

The Catechism: 1st Article of the Creed

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth.

What does this mean?

I believe that God has made me and all creatures; that He has given me my body and soul, eyes, ears, and all my members, my reason and all my senses, and still takes care of them. He also gives me clothing and shoes, food and drink, house and home, wife and children, land, animals, and all I have. He richly and daily provides me with all that I need to support this body and life. He defends me against all danger and guards and protects me from all evil. All this He does only out of fatherly, divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness in me. For all this it is my duty to thank and praise, serve and obey Him. This is most certainly true.
