## **CATECHETICAL THEME:**

God the Son - True Man

#### This Week's Catechetical Theme: God the Son – True Man

The eternal Son of God, the Second Person of the Holy Trinity, took on flesh and became a man. He did not just appear to be like a man. He was and is a real male human being. This is the focus of this week's devotional material. That the divine Son of God would also be a real human being is undoubtedly a mystery. But it is a mystery which was necessary in order for real life human beings to be saved from their sin. Atonement needed to be made and the blood of animals would not suffice. Only the blood of a man could be offered for the sins of man. And so, for our salvation, the Son of God becomes a man. God bless your time in His Word!

And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Plate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. What does this mean?

I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true man, born of the Virgin Mary, is my Lord, who has redeemed me, a lost and condemned person, purchased and won me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil; not with gold or silver, but with His holy, precious blood and with His innocent suffering and death, that I may be His own and live under Him in His kingdom and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness, just as He is risen from the dead, lives and reigns to all eternity. This is most certainly true.
