# CATECHETICAL THEME: The Lord's Prayer – 1<sup>st</sup> Petition

## This Week's Catechetical Theme: The Lord's Prayer – 1st Petition

Our focus on The Lord's Prayer continues this week with the 1st Petition: Hallowed Be Thy Name. To be sure, the name of Jesus is the name which is above all names. It is holy, by itself, and there is nothing man can do to make it less holy. However, we do pray that we who claim the name of the Lord would live lives by which His name would be kept holy among us, and so be seen as a name unlike any name by those to whom we bear witness. The true teaching of the Word of God in His name, and the holy lives which Christian lead, are indeed the way in which His name is kept holy among us. And so we pray that, in fact, His holy name would be kept holy among us!

# **The Catechism:** The Lord's Prayer – 1<sup>st</sup> Petition

Hallowed be Thy name.

What does this mean?

God's name is certainly holy in itself, but we pray in this petition that it may be kept holy among us also. *How is God's name kept holy?* God's name is kept holy when the Word of God is taught in its truth and purity, and we, as the children of God, also lead holy lives according to it. Help us to do this, dear Father in heaven! But anyone who teaches or lives contrary to God's Word profanes the name of God among us. Protect us from this, heavenly Father!
