CATECHETICAL THEME:

The Lord's Prayer – 2nd Petition

This Week's Catechetical Theme: The Lord's Prayer – 2nd Petition

"Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand" (Matt. 4:17). "My kingdom is not of this world" (John 18:36). "Come, you who are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world" (Matt. 25:34). Jesus Christ is King of Kings and Lord of Lord. He has a kingdom, given to Him by His Father. And He has a lot to say about that Kingdom. In fact, He teaches His disciples – He teaches us! – to pray for His kingdom to come! And yet, when we look at a map of the world, you will not see a plot of land, marked by borders, which we inhabit as an earthly kingdom. So what is the Kingdom of Heaven? How does it come to us? And what exactly is it for which we are praying when we pray the 2nd Petition of the Lord's Prayer? All of this is the subject of this week's catechetical material. God bless your time in His Word, and as His kingdom comes even among us!

The Catechism: The Lord's Prayer -2^{nd} Petition

Thy kingdom come.

What does this mean?

The kingdom of God certainly comes by itself without our prayer, but we pray in this petition that it may come to us also. *How does God's kingdom come?* God's kingdom comes when our heavenly Father gives us His Holy Spirit, so that by His grace we believe His holy Word and lead godly lives here in time and there in eternity.
