For there is no food and no water, and we loathe this worthless food.” ⁶Then the LORD sent fiery serpents among the people, and they bit the people, so that many people of Israel died. ⁷And the people came to Moses and said, “We have sinned, for we have spoken against the LORD and against you. What does this mean: The Gift Sunday of Easter is also referred to as Cantate. Cantate comes from the Latin translation of the first line of the introit (Cantate Domino), meaning "Sing to the Lord." (Psalm 98:1)
