CATECHETICAL THEME:

Sacraments in the OT: Day of Atonement

This Week's Catechetical Theme: Sacraments in the OT: Day of Atonement

In the Old Testament, on the Day of Atonement, the sins of Israel were atoned for by the blood of a sacrifice. That blood was poured out on the mercy seat, cleansing the place where the high priest would meet with the LORD. But the blood was also poured out upon the scapegoat. In this act, the sins of all of Israel were placed upon that goat, and then the goat was sent off into the wilderness. The sins of God's people were gone—the scapegoat had borne them all away. The Day of Atonement foreshadows the sacrifice of Jesus, and the blood He shed on behalf of the entire world. When His blood was shed, the temple curtain tore in two, so that all God's people might dwell with the LORD. And as the sins of Israel were taken away by the scapegoat, Jesus Himself has become the scapegoat, and His blood has borne away the sins of the entire world! Let us give thanks for the blood He shed—and now gives—as an atoning sacrifice for all our sins.

The Catechism: The Augsburg Confession – The Use of the Sacraments

Our churches teach that the Sacraments were ordained, not only to be marks of profession among men, but even more, to be signs and testimonies of God's will toward us. They were instituted to awaken and confirm faith in those who use them. Therefore, we must use the Sacraments in such a way that faith, which believes the promises offered and set forth through the Sacraments is increased [2 Thessalonians 1:3] (AC, XIII, 1-2).

Questions to Discuss in the Home

Sun: Reflect upon today's text and sermon. **Mon:** Who has sinned and what do we desire because of it? Who was put forth as the payment for our sin? How does this passage say we have redemption? **Tues:** Who could have access to God in the Holy Place? Who does verse 12 say now has entered the holy place? By what means did He enter? What is the benefit (v. 15)? **Wed:** Where did the LORD promise to appear? What did Aaron have to have with him to come into the Holy Place (v. 3)? What had defiled the Holy Place (v. 16)? What atoned for it? Whose sins were to be confessed over the live goat (v. 21)? What did the goat bear away with it into the wilderness (v. 22)? How is this goat a "scapegoat"? **Thurs:** What kind of sacrifice did Christ offer, according to verse 12? What do verses 17-18 indicate Christ's sacrifice does for us? What access does His sacrifice grant us (v. 19)? **Fri:** What does John call Jesus? What does John say Jesus will do? How is this like, but even better, than what the scapegoat did on the Day of Atonement? **Sat:** In Preparation for Sunday, reflect upon today's texts.
