What Is Baptism?

This Week's Catechetical Theme: What Is Baptism?

"To baptize," simply means "to wash." And in our day-to-day lives we wash many things: we wash dishes, we wash cars, we even wash ourselves. But there is a washing that is set apart from all other types of washing. This is the washing which Christ our Lord has given us Himself. And while it certainly does include water, it also includes His Word. And the word it includes is His very name! When a person is baptized in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, that person is washed clean in the name of the triune God. The person has the name of God written upon him or her, and is therefore marked as God's own child! All our readings this week will further unpack the answer to this question: What is Baptism? God bless your time in His Word!
