How Can Water Do Such Great Things?

This Week's Catechetical Theme: How Can Water Do Such Great Things?

This week's catechetical focus would have us consider how the waters of Holy Baptism can do such great things of forgiving sins, rescuing from death and the devil, and giving eternal salvation. The Old Testament story of Naaman, one of this week's Bible narratives, helps to illustrate both the power of God's Word to accomplish what He promises, as well as the nature of faith, which receives what God desires to give. Naaman the leper needed healing. Through Elisha the prophet the LORD had promised to give that healing. At first, Naaman would reject what God had offered, the very thing that he needed. He wanted to see some miraculous sign, or to be able to contribute something to his healing. But by rejecting what God had offered, he would have remained in his leprosy. Thankfully, his servants talked some sense into him, and he would later receive what the LORD had promised. And though he had rejected, the LORD was faithful to His promise to deliver healing. The Word of the LORD, attached to water, was powerful, and did the very thing the LORD had promised it to do. This week we'll continue to discover how the Word of God can do such marvelous things in Holy Baptism. God bless your time in His Word!

The Catechism: Baptismal Regeneration

How can water do such great things?

Certainly not just water, but the word of God in and with the water does these things, along with the faith, which trusts this word of God in the water. For without God's word the water is plain water and no Baptism. But with the word of God it is a Baptism, that is, a life-giving water, rich in grace, and a washing of the new birth in the Holy Spirit, as St. Paul says in Titus, chapter three: "He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, whom He poured out on us generously through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that, having been justified by His grace, we might become heirs having the hope of eternal life. This is a trustworthy saying." (Titus 3:5-8)

What does this passage indicate happens in Holy Baptism? How is this possible? Fri: How does this passage teach us to appreciate what happens when God's name is placed upon us in Holy Baptism? What is it important to have God's name upon us? Sat: In preparation for Sunday, reflect upon today's texts.
