CATECHETICAL THEME:

The Liturgy of Confession

This Week's Catechetical Theme: The Liturgy of Confession

To have peace with God is to have nothing standing between you and God, to be in full communion with him. Such peace is what Jesus came to bring to a sinful humanity, who would otherwise be separated from God for eternity. This peace is demonstrated on the evening of the first Easter when Jesus came into that locked room full of fearful disciples and said, "Peace be with you." He then told them that He would be sending them to bring this peace to others. And how would they be bringing this peace? In the forgiveness of sins: "If you forgive the sins of anyone, they are forgiven" (John 20:23). This week's devotional material puts before us the promise of forgiveness that Jesus speaks to those who have confessed their sins. God bless your time in His Word!
