

Holy Gospel*: John 1:19-28

The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the 1st chapter. Glory be to Thee, O Lord.

¹⁹ And this is the testimony of John, when the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, "Who are you?" ²⁰ He confessed, and did not deny, but confessed, "I am not the Christ." ²¹ And they asked him, "What then? Are you Elijah?" He said, "I am not." "Are you the Prophet?" And he answered, "No." ²² So they said to him, "Who are you? We need to give an answer to those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?" ²³ He said, "I am the voice of one crying out in the wilderness, 'Make straight the way of the Lord,' as the prophet Isaiah said." ²⁴ (Now

they had been sent from the Pharisees.) ²⁵ They asked him, "Then why are you baptizing, if you are neither the Christ, nor Elijah, nor the Prophet?" ²⁶ John answered them, "I baptize with water, but among you stands one you do not know, ²⁷ even he who comes after me, the strap of whose sandal I am not worthy to untie." ²⁸ These things took place in Bethany across the Jordan, where John was baptizing.

What does this mean? The Fourth Sunday in Advent is also known as Rorate Coeli, which in Latin means, "Drop down heavens." This is the opening verse of the introit appointed for today, "Drop down, ye heavens, from above, and let the skies pour down righteousness" (Isaiah 45:8 KJV)

The word "advent" comes from the Latin words, advenire (to come to) and adventus (an arrival). That we might be prepared to celebrate the blessed Feast of the Nativity of Christ our Lord, the Church has set aside the season of Advent as a time to reflect ad meditate upon the coming of our Lord Jesus in the Flesh, through His Word and Sacraments, and on the Last Day. Advent is also a time of preparation for Christ's coming through repentance and faith.

Welcome Rev. Dr. Dale Meyer: This morning, we welcome the Rev. Dr. Dale Meyer, former president of Concordia Seminary (St. Louis) as guest preacher and Bible study lecturer. We are grateful to have him in Ferrin this morning to proclaim God's Word.

Advent Midweek Services: Whether it's a spouse or child, family or friend, coworker or classmate, we often set high expectations for those around us. Yet, disappointment comes when our expectations are not met. During our midweek Advent Vespers, we will take a look at four different sons of men who were disappointments to their fathers - Cain, Ishmael, Esau, and Absalom. Yet, each week, we will also be pointed to a different Son who fulfills every hope and expectation in order to redeem us from our sins - Jesus Christ! So, join us on **December 21st at 7:00pm** for our midweek Advent Vespers as we consider the theme: "This Is My Son!"

Christmas Program Practice: Christmas program practice will be **December 22nd from 6:00pm-7:00pm with a meal from 7:00pm-7:30pm.** You may pick up your child(ren) at the school.

Christmas Eve: Christmas Eve is this **Saturday, December 24th**. Join us to celebrate the birth of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. At **7:00pm**, the children will hold their annual Christmas Eve program where they will proclaim the Good News of our Savior's birth in Bethlehem.

At **9:00pm**, we will again offer a Lessons and Carols service. This is drawn from the Nine Lessons and Carols service that has been performed at King's College in Cambridge, England since 1918. In addition to singing several of your favorite Christmas hymns, you will hear how God is faithful to His promise in sending the Messiah, the One foretold throughout the ages.

Christmas Day: Christmas Day is this **Sunday, December 25th**. Before you get together with family and friends, join us to receive Christ's gifts in the Divine Service at **9:00am**.
