CATECHETICAL THEME:

Keys Administered: Public and Private

This Week's Catechetical Theme: Keys Administered: Public and Private

The Office of the Keys is that special authority which Christ has given to His Church on earth to forgive and retain sins. And while the office is carried out most visibly through the Office of the Public Ministry—that is, through the Pastor—the keys do not belong to the pastor himself; they belong to the Church. It is clear that the pastor exercises the office of the keys when he speaks Absolution, be it publicly or privately, through the sermon as he preaches Christ crucified for the forgiveness of sins, through the administration of the Lord's Supper by which Jesus forgives sins, and whenever he comforts repentant sinners with the forgiveness of sins. But when are the keys carried out by the rest of the Church—the people—and where does this take place? To whom do you have the authority to speak the forgiveness of sins? This is the topic of this week's devotional material.

The Catechism: What is the Office of the Keys?

Questions to Discuss in the Home

Sun: Reflect upon today's text and sermon. **Mon:** Notice that there is no comma between pastors and teachers (ESV). How does this inform us regarding the task of the pastor? How does verse 12 describe the pastoral task? **Tues:** According to this passage, how will a person believe? And how will a person hear the Word? And how do we know who is to preach? And what is a preacher to preach? **Wed** What does Jesus give to Peter? What is Peter to do? **Thurs:** Here Paul refers to those in the apostolic office, the duties of which continue on today in the Pastoral Office. How are we to think of our pastors? What does it mean to be a steward? Of what are pastors stewards (note: in Latin, mystery = sacrament)? **Fri:** How does verse 25 teach us to speak with one another? What does verse 28 encourage us to do? When we have sinned against each other, what does verse 32 teach us to do? **Sat:** In preparation for Sunday, reflect upon today's texts.
