The Priesthood of All Believers

This Week's Catechetical Theme: The Priesthood of All Believers

Each week we prepare for the Divine Service by confessing our sin; by pleading guilty before God and one another. And as we confess our sin God, who is faithful and just, keeps His promise to forgive our sin and cleanses us from all unrighteousness. He renews us in the righteousness we first received in Holy Baptism, and which is still proclaimed to us in the Gospel on account of the perfect sacrifice Jesus made on the cross for all sin. Having been the recipient of such unending mercy and love, how can we withhold such mercy from those who trespass against us? This week's catechetical material reminds us that we who are forgiven are blessed also to forgive.

Invocation: In the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

The Catechism: What is the Office of the Keys?

The Office of the Keys is that special authority which Christ has given to His church on earth to forgive the sins of repentant sinners, but to withhold forgiveness from the unrepentant as long as they do not repent.

Questions to Discuss in the Home

Sun: Reflect upon today's text and sermon. Mon: How will our sin affect us (see vv 3-4)? Should we hide our sin out of fear? What response to sin does this Psalm teach? What blessing is received? Tues: How does the Lord's Prayer affirm the teaching of the Parable of the Unmerciful Servant? What command/promise does Jesus speak at the end of this passage? Wed For how many sins did Jesus die on the cross? If Jesus died for all sins, can we limit forgiveness to any certain number? What does Jesus mean by 70 X 7? Thurs: How does his passage teach us to treat fellow Christians? How does verse 13 affirm Jesus teaching in the Parable of the Unforgiving Servant and the Lord's Prayer? Fri: How does this passage teach us to carry out the Law of God (v. 8). How does verse 13 affirm Jesus' command to forgive our brothers and sisters who sin against us? Sat: In preparation for Sunday, reflect upon today's texts.
