Old Testament Reading: Genesis 32:22-32

²² The same night he arose and took his two wives, his two female servants, and his eleven children, and crossed the ford of the Jabbok. ²³ He took them and sent them across the stream, and everything else that he had. ²⁴ And Jacob was left alone. And a man wrestled with him until the breaking of the day. ²⁵ When the man saw that he did not prevail against Jacob, he touched his hip socket, and Jacob's hip was put out of joint as he wrestled with him. ²⁶ Then he said, "Let me go, for the day has broken." But Jacob said, "I will not let you go unless you bless me." ²⁷ And he said to him, "What is your name?" And he said, "Jacob." ²⁸ Then he said, "Your name shall no longer be called Jacob, but Israel, for you have striven with God and with men, and have prevailed." ²⁹ Then Jacob asked him, "Please tell me your name." But he said, "Why is it that you ask my name?" What does this mean: The first Sunday in Lent is known as Invocabit, which, in Latin, means, “he shall call” (The ESV translates it, “when he calls”). This is the opening phrase of the Introit: “He shall call upon me and I will answer him” (Psalm 91:15).

Where did the alleluias go? Because of the penitential nature of Lent, the church sets aside the Alleluias and Gloria in Excelsis for a time being. It’s as we sing, “Alleluia can’t always be our song while here below; Alleluia, our transgressions make us for a while forgo; For the solemn time is coming when our tears for sin must flow” (LSB 417, Stz. 3).

Midweek Lenten Vespers: Throughout the Season of Lent, you're encouraged to join us Wednesdays at 7:00pm for our Midweek Lenten Vespers. The theme for these services is 'The Passion of Christ and the Catechism.' The ongoing truths that we find in the Catechism are drawn from the death of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Throughout our Midweek Lenten Services, we will reflect upon this connection and its ongoing application for us through the events and teachings of Christ during His blessed passion.

Private Confession and Absolution: The Lutheran Confessions state that private absolution should be retained and not abolished in the churches (Augsburg Confession XI). With this in mind, if at any time you desire private confession and absolution, please give Pastor Jennings a call to set-up a time to meet privately.

Lenten Devotional: Whether it's through Confirmation Class or family devotions, many of us are familiar with the words of the Small Catechism. Luther writes that once you've been taught the Small Catechism, we're to take up the Large Catechism, which gives us a richer and fuller knowledge of God's truths. Additionally, you should have a daily reading plan in your mailbox. This Lent, let us be students of the catechism, and joyfully read and take to heart this blessed gift that our church boldly confesses!
