CATECHETICAL THEME: The Resurrection of Our Lord

This Week's Catechetical Theme: Holy Week – The Resurrection of Our Lord

Alleluia! Christ is risen! This week, all our attention is centered on the resurrection of our Lord. Jesus' resurrection from the grave proclaims loud and clear what He declared with His dying breath on the cross, "It is finished." That is, sin is paid for. Death is undone. Hell is overthrown. His empty tomb shouts, "Amen" and "Yes, this is most certainly true" to Christ's victory over it all. In His resurrection we see a glimpse of our own, for that is the gift we receive in His victory. Eternal life in the resurrection is that which is ours because of our Lord's resurrection. Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

The Catechism: The 2nd Article of the Apostles' Creed

And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Plate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God, the Father Almighty. From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.

What does this mean?

I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true man, born of the Virgin Mary, is my Lord, who has redeemed me, a lost and condemned person, purchased and won me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil; not with gold or silver, but with His holy, precious blood and with His innocent suffering and death, that I may be His own and live under Him in His kingdom and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness, just as He is risen from the dead, lives and reigns to all eternity. This is most certainly true.
