This Week's Catechetical Theme: What are the benefits of such eating and drinking?

The Sacrament of the Altar is that by which the Lord Jesus Christ feeds and nourishes His people with food that will lead to eternal life. As the Large Catechism teaches: "Those who are mindful of their weakness desire to be rid of it and long for help. They should regard and use the Sacrament just like a precious antidote against the poison that they have in them. Here in the Sacrament you are to receive from the lips of Christ forgiveness of sins. It contains and brings with it God's grace and the Spirit with all His gifts, protection, shelter, and power against death and the devil and all misfortune (439:70). Questions to Discuss in the Home

Sun: Reflect upon today's text and sermon. Mon: What does it mean that the people were "once alienated"? By what are they reconciled? What benefit is given in "his body of flesh"? Tues: How is this passage similar to yesterday's from Colossians? What does it mean to be "ransomed"? By what were they ransomed? What blessing does the blood of Jesus bring? Wed: John 6 was written to Christians who were already gathering to receive the Word and Sacraments. What miracle did Jesus perform? How did the people respond (v 15)? Did they understand in what sense Jesus could provide blessings for them? Thurs: Who is the mediator of a new covenant? What does Jesus call the "new covenant" (Luke 22:20)? This is a description of the entire Christian Church. What speaks a good word about them? Fri: What is it that cleanses us from all sin? How does this provide fellowship for us? Why is this message worth proclaiming? Sat: In preparation for Sunday, reflect upon today's texts.
