# CATECHETICAL THEME: Closed Communion

## This Week's Catechetical Theme: Closed Communion

Jesus desires to feed the people of God with His body and blood. He desires that the faithful would receive forgiveness, life and salvation through this faithful reception. And those who have faith in His words, "given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins," have exactly what Jesus intends to give: His body and blood and the forgiveness of sins! Unfortunately, not everyone believes Jesus' words, or trusts that He is giving what He says He is giving. And if such a person were to receive Holy Communion in this "unworthy manner," he or she would be sinning against the body and blood of Christ (1 Cor. 11:27). If this is the case, what are we to do? Should we give the Lord's Supper to those who deny Jesus' own word and promise? On the contrary. We are to patiently bear witness to what the Lord has said, take every opportunity to teach the truth of God's Word, and pray that His Holy Spirit reveals the truth of Christ's words to those who struggle to believe them.

**Invocation:** In the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

The Catechism: The Sacrament of the Altar

Who receives this sacrament worthily?

Fasting and bodily preparation are certainly fine outward training. But that person is truly worthy and well prepared who has faith in these words: "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins." But anyone who does not believe these words or doubts them is unworthy and unprepared, for the words "for you" require all hearts to believe.

Why should we avoid them? Should we commune with them? **Sat:** In preparation for Sunday, reflect upon today's texts.
