#### **Old Testament Reading: Numbers 21:4-9**

<sup>4</sup> From Mount Hor they set out by the way to the Red Sea, to go around the land of Edom. And the people became impatient on the way. <sup>5</sup> And the people spoke against God and against Moses, "Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? For there is no food and no water, and we loathe this worthless food." <sup>6</sup> Then the LORD sent fiery serpents among the people, and they bit the people, so that many people of Israel died. <sup>7</sup> And the people came to Moses and said, "We have sinned, for we have spoken against the LORD and against you. Pray to the LORD, that he take away the serpents from us." So Moses prayed for the people. <sup>8</sup> And the LORD said to Moses, "Make a fiery serpent and set it on a pole, and everyone who is bitten, when he sees it, shall live." <sup>9</sup> So Moses made a bronze serpent and set it on a pole. #### **Announcements**

What does this mean: Rogate comes from the Latin verb *rogare* meaning "to ask or pray." Traditionally, this day is set aside as one on which Christians "ask" or "pray" to God for His bountiful blessing upon the fields. In the spring, when the fields are becoming green, there is promise of a good harvest. However, there is also the possibilities of destruction through frost, hail, wind, tornadoes, and rain. Our prayers on this day are a reminder of how feeble we truly are. We turn with humility and confidence to the Giver of all things. For it is not the earth alone, nor the busy hand of man upon which the increase depends, but it is God for Christ's sake who gives the increase.

Ascension of Our Lord: This Thursday, May 18th, the church celebrates the Ascension of Our Lord. You and your family are encouraged to attend the Divine Service starting at 7:00 p.m. On the fortieth day after His resurrection, our Lord ascended to the right hand of the Father. Although Jesus is hidden from our physical eyes, He is not absent from

us. Having ascended to the right hand of the throne of God, He directs all things for the good of His Bride the church. Through His Word and Sacraments, He draws near to bestow upon us the gifts of His crucifixion and resurrection.
