1. A Guide for Daily Meditation and Prayer for the week following the Fourteenth Sunday after Trinity (September 10th – September 16th)

CATECHETICAL THEME:

1st Commandment

This Week's Catechetical Theme: 2nd & 3rd Commandments

We continue our consideration of the Ten Commandments this week by focusing on both the Second and Third Commandments. The Second Commandment teaches us how to us the name of the LORD. The LORD has given His name so that His children might call upon it in every trouble, pray, praise, and give thanks. Of course, His name is holy, above all other names, and so it is good, right, and salutary that His name should be treated as such. And so, we are not to misuse His name by cursing, swearing, using satanic arts, lying, or deceiving by His name.

The Third Commandment teaches us, "Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy." It's easy to think of this commandment being primarily about not doing work. Indeed, many understand it to mean exactly that. In fact, this understanding is what caused the Pharisees to be opposed to Jesus in Sunday's Gospel (Luke 14:1-11). But why did the LORD command the people of God to rest from the labor? It wasn't for the sake of rest, but for the sake of the people. For while they rested from their work, they were to gather so that they might learn their salvation and life comes entirely from God apart from their work. As God created all things, He is the only source of life and salvation. God bless your time in His Word as you consider the Second and Third Commandments this week!

When his parents found him, what was he doing? How does Jesus keep the Third Commandment? Why is it necessary for Him to keep this commandment? Fri: What was Martha concerned with doing? What did Mary do? Why was Mary commended for this? How did Mary keep the Third Commandment? Sat: In preparation for Sunday, reflect upon today's texts.
