# This Week's Catechetical Theme: 2<sup>nd</sup> Article of the Creed (Incarnation)

This week we want to focus our attention on the mystery of our Lord's incarnation. The portion of the Small Catechism for us to consider is the Second Article of the Apostles' Creed, in which we confess the miracle of Jesus' conception, birth and life. That the eternal Son of God would humble himself by taking on flesh to dwell among a sinful humanity is a mystery that we shall ponder; for in that mystery is the very Gospel of salvation. The Son of God is Jesus, the child born of Mary, who is our Savior! God bless your time in His Word!

## The Catechism: 2<sup>nd</sup> Article of the Creed (Incarnation)

And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Plate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God, the Father Almighty. From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.

What does this mean?

I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true man, born of the Virgin Mary, is my Lord, who has redeemed me, a lost and condemned person, purchased and won me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil; not with gold or silver, but with His holy, precious blood and with His innocent suffering and death, that I may be His own and live under Him in His kingdom and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness, just as He is risen from the dead, lives and reigns to all eternity. This is most certainly true.
