Introduction to the Lord's Prayer

This Week's Catechetical Theme: Introduction to the Lord's Prayer

When Jesus teaches us to pray, He teaches us to say, "Our Father, who art in heaven." Notice that the word is "our," not "my," for you are not an only child. On the contrary, you are baptized children, with brothers and sisters as numerous as the stars in the sky and the grains of sand on the seashore. And so, in this prayer, your voice is joined to that of the whole Christian Church and also with our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. And to whom do you pray? To your Father; your loving heavenly Father, who delights to hear and receive your prayers. Martin Luther teaches us that, with these words God tenderly invites us to believe that He is our true Father, and that we are His true children." And so, as His children, we can pray with all boldness and confidence, as little children speak to, and ask from, their own dear fathers. This is the subject of the week's devotional material. God bless your time in His Word!
