This Week's Catechetical Theme: 3rd Petition of the Lord's Prayer

On the 3rd Petition, Martin Luther writes the following: "We have this comfort and confidence: the devil's will and purpose and all our enemies shall and must fail and come to nothing, no matter how proud, secure, and powerful they know themselves to be. For if their will were not broken and hindered, God's kingdom could not remain on earth nor His name be hallowed" (LC III, 70). The Devil, the world, and our sinful flesh, these three seek to destroy us and God's Kingdom. And so we pray in this petition that the LORD, who desires all to be saved, would break and hinder every evil plan, so that His will would be done among us. This is the theme of this week's study. God bless your time in His Word!

The Catechism: 3rd Petition of the Lord's Prayer

Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

What does this mean? The good and gracious will of God is done even without our prayer, but we pray in this petition that it may be done among us also.

How is God's will done? God's will is done when he breaks and hinders every evil plan and purpose of the devil, the world, and our sinful nature, which do not want us to hallow God's name or let His kingdom come; and when He strengthens and keeps us firm in His Word and faith until we die. This is His good and gracious will.
