CATECHETICAL THEME:

What Is the Sacrament of the Altar?

This Week's Catechetical Theme: What Is the Sacrament of the Altar?

Our catechetical focus this week turns our attention to the institution of the Lord's Supper. This Sacrament was not invented or introduced by any man. Instead, is was instituted and established by God Himself. On the night when He was betrayed, Jesus says of the bread, "Take, eat; this is My body, which is given for you." Of the cup, Jesus says, "Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the new testament in my blood..." The same body and blood that was crucified on the cross and died for the sin of the world; the same body and blood that rose; is the same body and blood which He gives to us in this blessed meal. And as God bids us to eat and to drink of it, we do it so that we might receive His gift of forgiveness and life. God bless your time in His Word!

The Ten Commandments & The Apostles' Creed The Catechism:

What is the Sacrament of the Altar? It is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine, instituted by Christ Himself for us Christians to eat and to drink. Where is this written? The holy Evangelists Matthew, Mark, Luke and St. Paul write: Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to the disciples and said: "Take, eat; this is My body, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of Me." In the same way also He took the cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying, "Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the new testament in My blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."

Questions to Discuss in the Home

Sun: Reflect upon today's text and sermon. **Mon:** To what did the disciples dedicate themselves? Did they receive the Lord's Supper (the breaking bread) infrequently, or did they receive it often? **Tues:** What does Paul teach that we participate in when we eat and drink that which Jesus gives in the Lord's Supper? How are those that receive the supper to understand their relationship? **Wed:** On what night did Jesus institute the Lord's Supper? What does Jesus say that the disciples eat? What does he say that they drink? What is the benefit of this eating and drinking? **Thurs:** Were there already divisions in the congregation at Corinth? Why does Paul teach that those divisions are necessary? See verse 23; what is it that Paul had received and now delivers? **Fri:** What happens to those who fail to discern (believe) that the body of Christ is present in the Lord's Supper? How should this influence the Church's administration of the Sacrament? **Sat:** In preparation for Sunday, reflect upon today's texts.
